

The U.S. deals with all forms of governments. We must protect our backyard. You might want to hold your nose, but it's time we talked to the Venezuelans. We need to do it to protect ourselves from China entrenching themselves in our back yard.



Venezuela can't process the crudes they are producing. An exchange of light for heavy crudes would help them as well as U.S. refiners who are close to maximizing their use of light sweet crudes. Venezuela is currently using a very small amount of its refining capacity and that is from an extremely large base. The complex referred to as Paraguana Refining Center has three refineries with a total capacity of 955,000B/D. It is operating at 15%.

The Chinese are already in Venezuela.

Currently, petroleum products are tight across North America, and this would go a long way to ease that tightness.
