### **Décio Oddone, CEBRI's member**

Décio Fabricio Oddone da Costa is an electrical engineer graduated in the Federal University of Rio Grande do Sul. He studied petroleum engineering at Petrobras, the Advanced Management Program at Harvard Business School and the Advanced Management Program at Insead (European Institute of Business Administration). Among other honors, he received an honorary doctorate in Education from the Universidad de Aquino. He is former CEO at Brava Energia, CEO of Petrobras Bolivia, President and CEO of Petrobras Energia, Vice-President of Braskem, Director of Prumo Logística and General Director of the National Agency of Petroleum, Natural Gas and Biofuels (ANP) and CEO of Enauta Energia. He was a member of the Board of Directors of the Institute of the Americas (IoA), in the USA, and chaired the Bolivian-Brazilian Chamber of Commerce and the Argentine Chamber of the Oil Industry.



### **Ivan Sandra, Member of the International Advisory Board at CEBRI and CEO at Alize Energy**

Sandra is a Member of the Brazilian Center for International Relations (CEBRI)'s International Advisory Board. He has been the CEO of Alize Energy since January 2021 and is an expert in the field of energy transition with experience developing business and technology. Sandra has broad experience in the industry. He is board member at Havfram, a Norwegian company that offers solutions to Oil & Gas companies transitioning to wind power. He also founded and presided over the Mexican Sierra Oil & Gas from 2014 to 2019. He acted as International Advisor at JX Nippon Oil & Gas Exploration (2015-2018) and was Co-head, Global Oil & Gas Emerging Markets at Ernst & Young (2013-2014). He was the CEO of Energy Intelligence (2011-2012). Previously, Mr. Sandra occupied the position of VP of Strategy, Business Development and Mergers & Acquisitions at Equinor (2007-2011). Ivan Sandra is an active contributor to research institutions such as the Oxford Institute for Energy Studies and the Energy Policy Research Foundation. He is a regular guest at the Kearney Global Business Policy Council. He is also the co-founder of Mexico Actua, a think tank focused on circular economy studying the connection among water, energy and food. Sandra holds a M.S. in Geological and Earth Sciences and an MBA from The University of Edinburgh. He also holds a bachelor's degree in Geological and Earth Sciences from Baylor University.



### **Lucian Pugliaresi, President at Energy Policy Research Foundation**

Mr. Pugliaresi is President of the Energy Policy Research Foundation (EPRINC), a public policy energy think tank founded in 1944. He has led the organization's research effort on U.S. energy security, scope and benefits of the North American petroleum renaissance and the growing role of LNG in world trade, among other energy topics. EPRINC's programs are focused on the intersection of petroleum economics and public policy. Mr. Pugliaresi has served in a wide range of government posts, including

the National Security Council at the White House (Reagan Administration), Departments of State, Energy, and Interior, as well as the EPA. He has written extensively on energy and frequently testifies before various committees of the U.S. Congress. His career in the federal government included central policy roles in the development of the Strategic Petroleum Reserve, decontrol of domestic crude oil and gasoline prices, nuclear nonproliferation, offshore oil and gas leasing on federal lands, U.S. trade policy, environmental regulations, energy security, and U.S./Soviet relations.



## **Winston Fritsch, Trustee Emeritus at CEBRI**

Trustee Emeritus at the Brazilian Center for International Relations (CEBRI). Dr. Fritsch is President Director of Struttura Development and Project Finance and WF Associate Consultants. He was CEO of Petra Energia, Managing Director of Lehman Brothers in Brazil, CEO of Dresdner Bank in Brazil, Partner of Rio Bravo Investimentos, and Senior Partner of Orienta Investimentos, associated with Nomura Securities. He was Chairman of the Board of the Brazilian Association of International Banks and member of the Board of Febraban. In the Brazilian government, he was Secretary of Economic Policy at the Ministry of Finance. He was Director of the School of Economics and Administration of the Federal University of Rio de Janeiro (UFRJ), Dean of the Center for Social Sciences of PUC-Rio, Professor of the MBA Program at COPPEAD Graduate School of Business, which is UFRJ's Business School and is a member of the International Advisory Board of the London Business School. Dr. Fritsch, received a bachelor's and master's degree in Engineering from UFRJ, and a PhD in Economics from the University of Cambridge.
